<p><b>Minimum Admission Requirements</b></p>	<p>The application period for admission to the BBA-SCM Programme follows those of other programmes offered by HSUHK, which is normally from November of the preceding year of study to August of the year of study.</p> <p>In 2022-23, the minimum requirements for entry to <b>BBA-SCM Year 1</b> of the Degree Programmes are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Form 6 graduates with Level 3 or above in Chinese Language and English Language, Level 2 or above in Mathematics, Liberal Studies and one other subject in HKDSE; OR</li> <li>• Applicants with equivalent qualifications; OR</li> <li>• Mature students (aged 23 or above by September of the year of admission) with a minimum of 2 years' working experience in their chosen field of study, or the ability to pursue their chosen field of study.</li> </ul> <p>For students who possess qualifications other than the above, your applications will be considered on a case-by-case basis.</p> <p>In 2022-23, the minimum requirements for entry to <b>BBA-SCM Year 3</b> of the Degree Programmes are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Applicants should have completed an Associate Degree or Higher Diploma in a related discipline from a recognised institution in Hong Kong or overseas, with a minimum overall GPA of 2.5 or equivalent.</li> </ul>
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<b>Credits Required for Graduation</b>	Students will be required to study at least 40 modules of 120 credits in total over four years.
